Road America – What does Jack do?

- Post event inventory and status
- Review RA contract for changes/ impacts
- Post race clean-up – power washes inside floor and outdoor grill area as needed
- Reviews each race from year to year for planning
- Reviews all vendors from year to year for product purchase, pricing and amounts to be bought
- Places all orders prior to each event – Sysco, Miesfeld, Coke, Flipse, Larry's Distributing, Cedar Crest, Riley Bakery, Sargento and Serv-Ice
- Pickup cheese
- Wednesday and Thursday before event go to track to receive orders
- Stock back shelves, beverage coolers, ice cream freezer and snacks for event
- Rotate meat/ product from freezers
- Review Invoices
- Clean-Up Days before season – insure all equipment is in good running order. Repair was needed. Water seal picnic tables. Do all building/ grounds repairs/ maintenance as needed.
- Clean-Up Days after season – Remove all mats to walk-in cooler. Remove all product from back shelves excluding non-perishable products (i.e. paper goods), clean grease trap on inside grill (Yucky job if you've ever done it), clean and prop open all refrigerators/ freezers,
- Insure fire extinguisher is up to code
- Distribute nonreturnable products to designated areas.
- Clean all meat bins on last day of event

Road America – What does Karen do?

- Review insurance policy and pay
- Beverage Licenses – paperwork, get notarized, pay and pick-up at Town of Plymouth Offices
- Sheboygan County Health Dept. License
- Do RA Pre-Season Paperwork
- Review RA Contract form impacts/ changes
- Review and purchase product needs not bought by suppliers i.e. condiments, sour cream, milk, margarine, flavored creamer, hot chocolate, tea, sweeteners, mayo, baggies, foil/ saran wrap, coffee (decaf/ reg.), cleaning supplies, trash bags, salt/ pepper, PAM, etc. Go to Costco, Wal-Mart and Piggly Wiggly
- Do pre-season RA paperwork – tickets request for each event and hard cards
- Arrange with bank for money needed and pickup
- Solicit workers for all races
- Track schedule to insure full coverage
- Get RA tickets and distribute
- Monitor RA sign-in document
- Arrive 5 am daily to prep stand for 7am opening – open flaps, situate rolls, wipe down inside /outside counters and shelves, Friday do brat patties on inside grill, get coffee and coffee setup ready – 2 regular, 1 decaf, prepare salsa, hot peppers, and cheese for breakfast, fill snack displays, fill napkin holders (in/ out), set up money drawers, setup dishwashing tubs, setup nacho cheese, setup ham and eggs
- Setup sandwich papers

- Saturday/ Sunday morning move meat bins from walk-in to steam table
- Setup taco meat in Nesco and monitor through the day. Drain grease when done, and add salsa (3/4 to 1 bottle for a full Nesco)
- Cut tomatoes, lettuce for sandwiches
- Bag onions, pickles and sauerkraut
- Review supplies for next race – shop as needed
- Post event - store/ freeze product as needed
- Do post event RA reports – credentials and sales
- Pay bills – vendors, WI Sales tax, RA commission
- Report daily sales to Jack.
- Count tip jars – deposit
- Deposit money
- Pre- Post season cleanup as defined above

What does Don do?

- Weekend or Monday before event drains, sanitizes and fills water tank at SJB Stand (4-5 hour process)
- Works all 3 days where needed
- Cleans meat bins on last day of event
- Stocks beverage coolers as needed
- Backup person for money
- Pre/ post season maintenance
- Assists with stocking

What does Marvin do?

- Picks up and returns water jugs to Artesian Wells
- Delivers leftover rolls to Plymouth Food Pantry
- Runs for products as needed throughout event
- Stocks beverage coolers as needed
- Pre/ Post season cleanup
- Brings Donna Mae
